## 11th Grade Classes

In 11th grade students may begin to select Advanced Placement courses. Although we know that many CIS students are highly motivated, we also know from previous experience the emotional and physical toll taking too many AP classes can take. Like many independent schools, CIS sets a cap of four AP courses in a year and recommends no more than three. Any student that is considering taking more than three AP courses must meet with Dr. Roth and must submit an AP Overload Appeal Form at that time.
